DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Dear Friend of Oaktown Jazz Workshops,

We are proud to share with you news from 2022 – a year of growth and expansiveness. We added two new classes to support our students' passions. Our Live Audio Reinforcement class offers students interested in the technical aspects of presenting concerts hands-on audio production experience. OJW's first ever Vocal Ensemble class focuses on singing jazz, soul, contemporary, and world music in four-part harmony!

We launched a concert series that featured OJW alumni leading their own musical groups. These remarkable performances brought together musicians and audiences from over the last 28 years of OJW's programs and events. These alumni concerts strengthen the multigenerational musical community we have built over decades and inspire current students to imagine the many paths open to them.

Through Jazz in the Schools, we made 32 visits to public schools. Our Jazz Encounters clinics brought internationally recognized touring musicians to share their experience and knowledge with young musicians. And we provided over 500 private lessons to students, meeting a new surge in demand for one-on-one instruction. In our year-round workshops – the core of our programming – dedicated faculty members welcomed young musicians into our safe and supportive space, where they improved their skills and developed their individual musical voices while collaborating with others. Thank you for supporting local young people seeking opportunities for creative expression and artistic development!

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MISSION & VISION

OUR MISSION is to promote, preserve, and perform jazz music so that all youth – particularly under-served youth – develop a sense of ownership and pride in jazz as a uniquely American cultural tradition.

OUR VISION is a safe space for artistic expression, where thousands of young musicians from varied backgrounds connect through music, discover their own distinct voices, and develop the skills to become supportive and engaged members of their communities – skills like self-discipline, the ability to collaborate, and the courage to perform before a live audience.

OUR PROGRAMS for San Francisco Bay Area youth, ages 10-18, include the following:

- **Combo Workshops:** Youth learn to improvise solos on their instruments while playing different types of jazz and blues tunes in a band setting.
- **Performance Ensemble Workshops:** Youth continue to improve their musicianship in a band setting and perform concerts throughout the San Francisco Bay Area.
- Seasonal Classes: Jazz Improvisation (10-week sessions in spring, fall), Music Theory (10week sessions in spring, fall), Vocal Ensemble (10-week sessions in spring, fall, winter), and Live Audio Reinforcement (3-week session in winter).
- Jazz Encounters: Clinics with high-profile guest musicians on tour.
- **One-on-one Private Lessons:** Individualized music lessons for OJW students, taught by a great lineup of professional musicians, including our teaching staff and alumni.
- Jazz in the Schools: OJW instructors lead sectionals, conduct clinics, and give performances and presentations in area public schools.

JAZZ ENCOUNTERS



Oaktown Jazz Workshops gives young musicians the chance to meet world-class touring jazz musicians who graciously donate their time to work with local young musicians. Our Jazz Encounter clinics have historically been produced in collaboration with Yoshi's Jazz House. The format changes from artist to artist, ranging from lecture/demonstrations to hands-on jam sessions. In 2022, we hosted clinics with:

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JAZZ IN THE SCHOOLS




Oaktown Jazz Workshops presented "Women in Blues & Jazz" for 1,000 students at Rancho Medanos Middle School and Pittsburg High School. The performances by vocalist Faye Carol and trio, and OJW's young musicians, brought the joy and power of live performance, and instilled a sense of pride in students for the cultural contributions of African-American female artists. Faye Carol took the youth on a historical ride of over 100 years of women in jazz and blues.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Oaktown Jazz Workshops' programming is supported by income from tuition, performance fees, benefit concerts, individual donations, and foundation and government grants.

Oaktown Jazz Workshops' 2022 consisted of a full year of in-person programming. After the pandemic lull, community events began to be rescheduled, and requests for OJW to provide live music started coming in. As a result, income from OJW performance fees started to rebound. Thankfully, government and foundation funders continued to offer COVID relief grants, which helped OJW compensate for the shortfall.

Oaktown Jazz Workshops has seen a considerable uptick in the demand for one-on-one lessons; in 2022 alone, our music instructors and Youth Mentors provided 500 individual lessons. At the same time, we began to add new classes, attracting new students, and hosting more weekend concerts at our Jack London Square concert space, including a concert series featuring Oaktown Jazz Alumni.
